

**TOWN OF TROY
SPECIAL BOARD MEETING**

March 22, 2016

A special board meeting was held on Tuesday, March 22, 2016, at 1:00 p.m., at the Town of Troy town hall for the purpose of discussing the cost of hiring the county to maintain the town roads.

Present were Roger Mack, Don Meise, Jeff Lohr, Mary Zins, and Steve Muchow, Sauk County Highway Commissioner.

The following topics were covered:

- The county furnishes the staff with the township informing them what needs to be done after they have done their own patrolling.
- When plowing the roads is necessary, the county's workday begins at 4:00 a.m.
- The township can furnish the sand/salt; otherwise, the county would and bill said township.
- The township is billed for time and material costs. The patrolman's hourly rate is approximately \$20/hr. plus \$18/hr. for benefits such as workman's compensation and insurance. Overtime is based on over eight (8) hours a day; holidays and weekends are also considered overtime compensation.
- The county would require a two-year verbal commitment.
- The approximate cost for the township would be \$120,000-\$130,00/yr. to hire the county.

Mr. Muchow left the meeting at 1:50 p.m. The board held further discussion regarding the pros and cons of hiring the county versus an individual.

No decision was made when the meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.
